

Fall Bird Report for Pineywoods Audubon Society
September 1 – November 30, 2020

The fall season is always complex and hard to summarize, as we transition from the hot and steamy days of early September to the chilly days of late November, but it was generally mild this year. Perhaps most noteworthy was the lack of regular rain and by the end of the season the region was quite dry and lake levels were low. Weak cool fronts came through regularly, but with little fanfare, and many days were clear, calm and cool – beautiful weather, but not conducive to grounding migrants. A very hard first freeze came overnight on Nov 30-Dec 1, considerably later than our average date.

In general, waterfowl were late in arriving, shorebirds were almost completely absent due to lack of habitat, and passerine migrants were few and far between until October. While it was not a very good season for migrant warblers there was a surprising number of late records. Most significantly, several irregular winter species were on the move early in good numbers, especially Red-breasted Nuthatch, Golden-crowned Kinglet, Purple Finch and Pine Siskin.

First dates for some winter residents:

Ring-necked Duck - 4 at the TX 147 causeway Oct 24 (DW, RT).

Canvasback - a male at the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW).

Bufflehead - at Ellen Trout Lake on Nov 13 (GH); on Nov 15 there were 12 there (DW, RT).

American Woodcock – 1 in Cherokee County on Nov 7 (Jeff Reid fide CS)

Common Loon – 1 migrant over Marion Ferry Oct 17 was very early (DW); 19 at Indian Mounds Rec Area on Toledo Bend on 8 Nov was a high count for so early in the season (DB).

American White Pelican – 12 at North Toledo Bend WMA on Sept 20 (DB, J Sm).

Yellow-bellied Sapsucker – singles in Nacogdoches Sept 27 (DW, RT) and Lufkin Oct 2 (GH).

Northern Flicker – 3 near Huntington Sept 26 (JC).

Blue-headed Vireo - 1 in Lufkin Oct 11 (GH).

Red-breasted Nuthatch – this species is on the move this winter. The first was a recording of an unseen bird near Boykin Springs on Sept 29 (LW), while the first seen was 1 in Center Sept 30 (J Sm).

Winter Wren - 1 heard at the TX 147 causeway Oct 24 (RT); 1 seen in Nacogdoches Oct 29 (AT).

Brown Creeper – singles in Center Oct 24 (J Sm); Nacogdoches Nov 4 (LW); south Nacogdoches Nov 5 (AT); and near Rusk Nov 13 (BW).

Golden-crowned Kinglet – singles at Marion Ferry Oct 17 (DW, RT); Nacogdoches Oct 24 (CS).

Ruby-crowned Kinglet – singles at McAlister Park Sept 28 (DW); Alazan Bayou WMA Sept 30 (DW); and Sabinetown Oct 4 (DB).

Hermit Thrush – 1 at the base of TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW).

American Pipit – 1 over the TX 147 causeway Oct 24 (RT).

Cedar Waxwing – 3 at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 30, one of them still in the streaky juvenile plumage rarely seen in our region (DW). This is a very early date for this species, which often doesn't appear until late Nov or later. More were spotted on Nov 12 on Boykin Creek (AT) and 40 were with migrating robins over Central Hts Nov 13 (MHW, DW).

Purple Finch - staged a major early invasion and were reported by many observers. A male photographed in Center Nov 2 was the first (J Sm). The next was a female at Ellen Trout Park Nov 4 (GH). Several were heard over the Nacogdoches Airport Nov 8 (RT). 2 females came to feeders in Center Nov 11 and by Nov 14 there were 8 (J Sm). The first one in Sabinetown appeared Nov 12 (DB). One in Cushing Nov 13 was the first one there (DS), as were 5 in Central Hts that same day (DW). 5 were seen in Nacogdoches Nov 16 (LW), while the first in Rusk was on Nov 18 (BW).

Pine Siskin – on the move in big numbers, our earliest flight in 50 years! The first were 4 over Central Hts on very early date of Oct 14 (MHW); 7 at feeders in Center on Oct 16 (J Sm); at Lake

Pinkston Oct 17 (LW); and at least one heard over Central Hts almost daily beginning Oct 18 (MHW). The first big flock was 90+ over the base of the TX 147 causeway on the Oct 24 cool front (RT, DW).

American Goldfinch -heard over Central Hts Nov 3-4 (MHW); 1 seen in Lufkin Nov 4 (GH); and the first in Nacogdoches Nov 7 (CS).

Le Conte's Sparrow – 1 at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW).

Chipping Sparrow – late to appear, they were seen near Huntington Oct 30 (JC) and then on Nov 1 they abruptly appeared in Central Hts (12; DW); Center (4; J Sm) and Lufkin (4; GH).

Fox Sparrow – 1 at the SFA Experimental Forest gate on Nov 23 (DW).

“Slate-colored” Junco -abruptly appeared on Nov 1 in Central Hts (2; DW); Lufkin (1; GH); and Center (3; J Sm). However, the first junco of any race was a bright male “**Oregon**” studied carefully in Cushing on and off all day Oct 17 (DS). This race is always rare in our region.

White-crowned Sparrow – the first was a high count of 11 near Huntington Oct 30 (JC); then singles in Central Hts Nov 1 (DW) and Lufkin Nov 4 (GH).

Harris's Sparrow – one in Cushing Dec 12 (DS).

White-throated Sparrow – singles in Lufkin Oct 15 (GH), Shelby County Oct 17 (LW); and Nacogdoches Oct 19 (JS).

Vesper Sparrow – 2 in the field at the SFA Experimental Forest on Nov 1 (RT).

Savannah Sparrow – 1 in Central Hts Oct 14 (DW).

Song Sparrow – singles on Oct 30 near Huntington (JC) and at the TX 147 causeway (DW).

Swamp Sparrow – 1 found dead on the SFASU campus Oct 22 (CS, JS).

Rusty Blackbird – 1 in w. Nacogdoches Co on Nov 28 (DW).

Brewer's Blackbird – 10 at a regular site in w. Nacogdoches Co on 28 Nov (DW).

Orange-crowned Warbler – singles in Lufkin Oct 5 (GH) and Central Hts Oct 8 (DW).

Yellow-rumped Warbler – singles at the TX 147 causeway Oct 10 (RT) and Lufkin Oct 11 (GH).

Bird Report:

Waterfowl were largely lacking until the first good cold fronts in late Oct and early Nov. 360 Greater White-fronted Geese passed over Lake Murvaul (Panola Co) in 3 flocks on Nov 22 (DW). On Nov 1 at the Nacogdoches sewage ponds there were suddenly 100 Gadwall, 10 American Wigeon, 20 Northern Shoveler, 5 Green-winged Teal, 12 Lesser Scaup and a male Hooded Merganser (RT); almost no ducks were here a few days earlier (DW). A high count of 325 Gadwall was at the Nac ponds Nov 16 (DW). A **Greater Scaup** with 3 Lesser Scaup at Lake Nacogdoches on Nov 29 provided a great comparison (DW). Two **Common Goldeneyes** were on Lake Nacogdoches Dec 4 (DW). A female **Surf Scoter** found on Ellen Trout Lake in Lufkin Nov 15 (DW, RT) was seen later in the day by several more observers (GH, AT, LW) and good photos were obtained. We have only 6 previous area records and this is the first since 2002. 40+ Pied-billed Grebes at the TX 147 causeway Oct 5 included 2 half-grown juveniles (DW). No Horned Grebes were seen on Toledo Bend on Nov 13, but then 16 off Sabinetown on Nov 17 increased to a very high count of **72** on Nov 21 (DB). 4 at Kurth Lake Nov 19 were the first there (DB, D Be, GH) and 2 were on Lake Nacogdoches Dec 4 (DW).

A rare White-winged Dove was in Central Hts Nov 16-29 and later (DW). A paltry 6 Common Nighthawks over Central Hts Oct 10 (MHW) was season high count. The last Ruby-throated Hummingbird in Nacogdoches was a female to Oct 29 (CS, JS). A very late adult male in Central Hts Nov 6-7 was spotted by Ty D and confirmed by MHW, DW. A male **Rufous Hummingbird** was in Nacogdoches Sept 8-Nov 11 (Tammy Alders). A female-plumaged **Selasphorus sp?** visited Nacogdoches Sept 10-13 (TD) and another that appeared in Sabinetown Nov 10 was still present into Dec (DB). Both were likely Rufous, but the slight possibility of Allen's cannot be ruled out.

At least 6 Common Gallinules at Kurth Lake Oct 3 (DB, GH, J Sm) and 5 there Nov 19 (DB, GH, D Be) confirmed their continuing presence on this lake. A conservative count of 2500 American Coots was already on Kurth Lake Oct 3 (DB, GH, J Sm). Shorebirds were almost completely lacking this fall, but 7 Greater Yellowlegs were at Marion Ferry Nov 25 (DW). Gulls were strangely absent from Lake Rayburn and Toledo Bend Reservoir in Sept and most of October (DW, DB). The first seen on many

visits to the TX 147 causeway were 3 Ring-billed and 1 Herring on Oct 30 (DW). 30 Franklin's Gulls briefly rested on an island off the TX 147 causeway Nov 25 (DW), the only ones reported this fall. A Caspian Tern was along the Attoyac arm of Rayburn Sept 28 (DW) and 4 were low over Marion Ferry Oct 17 (DW, RT). 40 Forster's Terns on Kurth Lake Nov 19 (DB, D Be, GH) and again on Nov 22 (DB) were high counts for this lake. **2 Royal Terns** off the TX 147 causeway Sept 23 were likely driven inland by Tropical Storm Beta (DW). This casual visitor from the Gulf Coast has only been found in our region a few times, always after tropical weather disturbances.

There were few Wood Stork reports, but 6 were over TX 103 at the Attoyac on Sept 11 (DW). Almost unbelievable was a **Magnificent Frigatebird** photographed at Lake Murvaul (Panola Co) on Nov 22 (LW). What was it doing here, at this season and without any stormy weather? 2 Anhingas lingered through Nov 30 at Ellen Trout Park (m. obs.) and one was at the Nac ponds Nov 16 (DW). A Neotropical Cormorant at Ellen Trout Oct 3 was the last of the fall (DB, GH, J Sm). 120+ Little Blue Herons leaving the roost at TX 103 at the Attoyac Sept 19 was the season high count and 3 Tricolored Herons were also spotted that morning (DB, J Sm, RT, DW). On Sept 11 DW estimated 2850 Cattle Egrets leaving the roost at TX 103 at the Attoyac. Amazingly, the next day J Sm independently estimated the same number. (Aren't we good?). Numbers were down to 1200 on Sept 19 ((DB, J Sm, RT, DW). Late were a flock of 15 at the TX 147 causeway Oct 16 (DW, RT); a single in Central Hts Nov 5 (MHW); and one at the TX 147 causeway Nov 15 (DW, RT). A late Green Heron lingered at Ellen Trout Park to at least Nov 30 (MB, DW). A **Plegadis ibis** at the Nacogdoches sewer ponds Sept 17-Oct 25 **may have been a Glossy**, but it was never photographed or studied well enough to be absolutely certain (DW). There are no local records of Glossy. A trio of *Plegadis* at the SFASU farm Sept 26 included one that was definitely a White-faced (RT, DW, MHW), while an unidentified *Plegadis* came over McAlister Park on Rayburn on the Sept 28 front (DW) and a flock of 9 was low over Marion Ferry Oct 17 (DW, RT). The last was one over the TX 147 causeway Oct 24 (DW, RT). The last White Ibis were 2 juveniles at the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW). A **Roseate Spoonbill** at the Nac ponds was first noted Sept 18; 2 were there Oct 9-25 (DW). Another one found at the SFA Observatory Sept 26 (RT) was last seen Oct 10 (LW). 4 spoonbills were at Patroon Creek on Toledo Bend Sept 28 (Viron Barbay fide DW).

The season high count for Bald Eagle on many visits to the TX 147 causeway was at least 16 on the Oct 24 cool front (DW, RT). In spite of much watching relatively few Broad-winged Hawks were spotted. The first apparent migrant was one over the Nac ponds Sept 18 (DW). No high numbers were reported Sept 19 to Oct 2, but then on Oct 3 a big flight came through. Observers at Kurth Lake tallied a very conservative 1750+, the stream of birds passing as far as they could see with binoculars (DB, GH J Sm). A big kettle of 450+ was also spotted over Central Hts that same morning (DW, MHW). A **Swainson's Hawk** over Lufkin Oct 7 was the only one this fall (GH). The first Northern Flickers were 3 near Huntington Sept 26 (JC) and one in Central Hts Sept 29 (DW), while the one-day high count was 55+ diurnal migrants along the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW). Single Merlins were over the TX 147 causeway Oct 16 (DW) and Marion Ferry Oct 17 (DW, RT). The only Peregrine Falcon this fall was along the shore at the TX 147 causeway Oct 5 (DW).

The last Eastern Wood-Pewees were singles in Lufkin Oct 23 (GH); at the TX 147 causeway Oct 24 (DW, RT) and in Sabinetown Oct 28 (DB). Single Least Flycatchers in Nacogdoches Oct 4 (DW, RT) and on the TX 147 causeway Oct 5 (DW) were the last. 14 Eastern Phoebes at the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 was a good push (DW). A bright male **Vermilion Flycatcher** was a one-day wonder near Huntington Oct 19 (JC). The last Great Crested Flycatcher was one in the SFA Exp Forest Sept 26 (RT). Under the guidance of Cliff Shackelford there was **coverage at the flycatcher roost** on Northwest Loop 224 in Nacogdoches every evening from Sept 1-11 (CS, RS, AT, LW et al). There was a clear peak in numbers from Sept 3-9, with the high count of 550 Eastern Kingbirds and 300 Scissor-tailed Flycatchers on Sept 6 (LW). Another highlight of the watch was a non-vocal **Couch's/Tropical Kingbird** present and photographed Sept 3-4 (CS, AT, LW). A **Western Kingbird** in Diboll Oct 19-20 (RT) provided only the 5th fall record for Nacogdoches/Angelina Counties in 50 years - and they have all been in October! The last Scissor-tailed Flycatchers were singles at the TX 147 causeway Nov 15 (RT, DW) and in Central Hts Nov 17 (DW). A Loggerhead Shrike was seen near Center, where very scarce, on Sept 20 (DB, J Sm)

and another was near North Toledo Bend WMA Nov 2 (J Sm). A Bell's Vireo in Central Hts Sept 8 was a rarely-detected migrant (DW). A Yellow-throated Vireo at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 16 tied our latest date (DW). 50+ Cave Swallows came out from under the College St. bridge on the SFASU campus on Oct 4 and again Oct 9 (DW, RT, Ty D). **Red-breasted Nuthatch** was "on the move" this fall, the first a recording of an unseen bird from near Boykin Springs on Sept 29 (LW). One was seen in Center the next day, Sept 30 (J Sm), followed by singles in Nacogdoches Oct 9 (TD); near Rusk Oct 12 (BW); in Lufkin Oct 18 (GH); Nacogdoches Oct 22 (RS); and at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 24 (RT). 7 House Wrens at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 was a good push of migrants (DW). Marsh Wren reports were 2 on the SFASU campus Oct 4 (DW, RT); and singles at the TX 147 causeway Oct 16 (J Sm) and Oct 30 (DW); and at Indian Mounds Rec Area on Toledo Bend on Nov 8 (DB). High counts on Blue-gray Gnatcatchers were **215+** at and over the base of the TX 147 causeway Sept 11 (DW); 95 tallied there Sept 19 (DB, J Sm, RT, DW); and **150** total around TX 147 causeway and McAlister Park on the Sept 28 cool front (DW). Some numbers were still on the move Oct 16, when 18 were at the TX 147 causeway (DW). It looks like this will be a good winter for Golden-crowned Kinglet. The first was a somewhat early single at Marion Ferry Oct 17 (DW, RT) and the next was one in Nacogdoches Oct 24 (CS). They continued to appear more widely in early November. 130 American Robins over the TX 147 causeway on the Oct 24 cool front was the first sizable push detected (DW, RT). There were more migrant Gray Catbirds than usual this fall and they were reported at a number of localities from at least Sept 22-Oct 10 (m. obs.), with a high count of 3 at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 5 (DW). The first migrant Brown Thrasher in Central Hts appeared Sept 14 (DW), while 16+ at Alazan Bayou WMA Sept 30 was a good push of migrants (DW).

Purple Finches staged a major early invasion and were reported by many observers. A male photographed in Center Nov 2 was the first (J Sm). The next was a female at Ellen Trout Park Nov 4 and 3 there Nov 13 (GH). Several were heard over the Nacogdoches Airport Nov 8 (RT). 2 females came to feeders in Center Nov 11 and by Nov 14 there were 8 (J Sm). The first one in Sabinetown appeared Nov 12 (DB). One in Cushing Nov 13 was the first one there (DS), as were 5 in Central Hts that same day (DW). 5 appeared in Nacogdoches Nov 16 (LW), while the first in Rusk was Nov 18 (BW). **Pine Siskins** were also on the move in big numbers, our earliest arriving flight in 50 years! 4 were over Central Hts on the very early date of Oct 14 and at least one was heard here almost daily beginning Oct 18 (MHW). The next were 7 at a feeder in Center on Oct 16 (J Sm), while the first big number was a flock of 90+ over the base of the TX 147 causeway on the Oct 24 cool front (RT, DW). Interestingly, American Goldfinches did not show up especially early, with the first reports several heard over Central Hts Nov 3-4 (MHW); one seen in Lufkin Nov 4 (GH); and another in Nacogdoches Nov 7 (CS). A Grasshopper Sparrow was at the Nacogdoches Airport Nov 8 (DW, RT). There were 3 sightings of the easily-overlooked **Clay-colored Sparrow** this fall, 2 at Alazan Bayou WMA Sept 30 (DW); 1 at Ellen Trout Park Oct 3 (DB, J Sm); and 2 on the SFASU campus Oct 4 (DW, RT). A Lark Sparrow in Nacogdoches Oct 6 was likely a migrant (DW). 3 Lincoln's Sparrows at Alazan Bayou Sept 30 were the first (DW); no great numbers were ever detected this fall. A migrant Yellow-breasted Chat visited Central Hts Sept 10 (DW). A close **Western Meadowlark** at the TX 147 causeway Oct 5 called repeatedly to confirm the identification (DW), while another was studied visually, but not vocally, at very close range at the Nacogdoches Airport Nov 8 (DW, RT). The last Great-tailed Grackles reported in Nacogdoches were 2 on Oct 25 (DW). Where does this species go for the winter? The season high count on Baltimore Orioles was 25 in Central Hts Sept 9 (DW). The last were singles in Nacogdoches Sept 26 (CS); Center Oct 17 (J Sm); and an extremely late female that visited a suet feeder in Cushing **Nov 20-at least Dec 2** (DS).

Migrant warblers were generally scarce this fall, but with persistence a variety of species could be found, though not in any numbers. Especially noteworthy was the number of very late sightings of stragglers. A well-described **waterthrush** believed to be a **Louisiana** was along Lanana Creek in Nacogdoches on the remarkable date of Nov 23 (AT). A Blue-winged Warbler was at Alazan Bayou WMA Sept 22 (DW). A late Black-and-white Warbler was in Nacogdoches Nov 28 (AT). The only **Tennessee Warblers** were singles in Central Hts **Nov 1 and Nov 15** (both DW). Our previous latest ever

was Oct 30! The first Nashville Warbler was one at the base of the TX 147 causeway Sept 19 (DB, RT, DW), while the last was a very late one in Central Hts **Nov 13, our latest ever** by 7 days (DW). The only Mourning Warbler reported was one in Lufkin Oct 2 (GH). At least 7 single American Redstarts were found at various locations (m. obs.) from August 22 (Center; J Sm) to Oct 16 (TX 147 causeway; DW). The last Northern Parulas were singles in Nacogdoches Oct 19 (JS) and at the TX 147 causeway Oct 24 (DW, RT). The only Magnolia Warblers were singles at the TX 147 causeway Oct 5 (DW) and in Lufkin Oct 11 (GH). The last Yellow Warblers were singles at the TX 147 causeway Oct 5 (DW) and in Lufkin Oct 11 (GH). A drab juvenile Chestnut-sided Warbler was studied in Central Hts Oct 22 (DW). A female **Black-throated Blue Warbler** in Nacogdoches Sept 9 was seen by an observer very familiar with the species (TD). This is only the 3rd well-described record for our local area! A bright "**Yellow**" **Palm Warbler** photographed in the buttonbush at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW) was the *hypochrysaea* race, which has rarely been documented in Texas. A big push of 85+ Pine Warblers was tallied at the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW). The first Yellow-rumped Warblers were singles over the TX 147 causeway Oct 10 (RT) and another in Lufkin Oct 11 (GH). A surprisingly large early flock of 30+ was at the TX 147 causeway Oct 16 (DW). Oct 30 brought a major flight at the TX 147 causeway, with 105+ identified and many of the hundreds of re-orienting small passerines seen likely this species (DW). Two Yellow-throated Warblers in Lufkin Oct 8 were somewhat late (GH), but then a very late one was at the base of the TX 147 causeway **Nov 15** (DW, RT). This fall Black-throated Green Warbler was not as numerous as most years. The first was one on the Dorr Creek (St's Rest) Road Sept 6 (RT), while the last were 2 at the TX 147 causeway Nov 2 and a very late female in Central Hts **Nov 13** (both DW). Wilson's Warbler was scarcer than usual, but singles were seen in Central Hts Sept 10 (DW), Alazan Bayou WMA Sept 26 (LW) and Antioch Oct 1 (SO).

Late Summer Tanagers seem to be more frequent with each passing year. One was still in Lufkin Oct 25 (GH); another was on SFASU campus Oct 30-into Dec (LW, CS); and one was found on the Lanana Creek Trail in Nacogdoches Nov 26 & 28 (AT). A rare-in-fall **Scarlet Tanager** passed through Pecan Park Oct 4 (DW, RT). Two Rose-breasted Grosbeaks at the base of the TX 147 causeway Oct 16 were a surprise (DW, J Sm) and then when J Sm got home to Center one appeared at his feeders. At least 3 visited Lufkin on Oct 25 (GH). A **very late Blue Grosbeak** was photographed in Lufkin **Nov 4** (GH); a second bird present was likely this species also. The season high counts for Indigo Bunting were 105 at Alazan Bayou WMA Sept 30 (DW) and a conservative 30+ at Ellen Trout Oct 3 (DB, GH, J Sm). The last Painted Bunting was one in Central Hts Sept 29 (DW). Migrant Dickcissels seemed very scarce this fall and few were heard going over, but 5 were seen at Ellen Trout Park Oct 3 (DB, GH, J Sm) and a somewhat late one was at the TX 147 causeway Oct 30 (DW).
